Joseph had been in Egypt for 12 years when Isaac died. Jacob's favorite son has been missing for 12 years and then his father died.

4. Joseph (37-50)

How old were Jacob and Esau When Jacob stole the blessing?

Genesis 41:46,47 – Joseph was **30** when he first stood before Pharaoh and was given the 2nd highest position in the kingdom.

Genesis 45:6 – After 7 years of plenty and two years of famine in the land, Joseph is now **39.**

Genesis 47:9 – Jacob was **130** years of age when he went to Egypt.

We now know that Joseph was **39** when Jacob was **130.** That means Joseph was born when his father, Jacob, was **91.**

Jacob fled to Laban's house right after he stole the blessing. Then he worked for Laban for 14 years (Genesis 28:1-30:26). That means that Joseph was born **14** years after Jacob fled to Laban's house.

If we subtract 14 from 91, we learn that Jacob was 77 when he stole the blessing from Esau.

How long had Joseph been in Egypt When Isaac died?

- Isaac was **60** when Jacob was born (Gen. 25:26)
- Isaac was **180** when he died (35:28)
- Therefore, Jacob was **120** when his father (Isaac) died.
- We know that Jacob was **91** when Joseph was born (Gen. 41:46,47; 45:6; 47:9; 28:1-30:36).
- Joseph was **29** when Isaac died (120-91).
- Joseph was **17** when he was sold into slavery (37:2)
- Joseph had been in Egypt for **12** years when Isaac died.
