Moses (Compare Matthew 8:4 with Lev. 14:4-30 and Romans 10:5 with Lev. 18:5)

3. The Date

- Passover took place on the 14th day of the 1st month (Ex. 12:2,6)
- The Tabernacle was set up one year later – 1st day of the 1st month of 2nd year (Ex. 40:17)
- Numbers begins the 1st day of the 2nd month of the 2nd year (Numbers 1:1)
- Therefore the instructions recorded in Leviticus were given during the 1st month of the 2nd year after leaving Egypt (c. 1444 BC)

Genesis – Book of Beginnings

First 4 chapters Events

- Creation
- Fall
- Flood
- Babel

Final chapters

- Abraham
- Isaac
- Jacob
- Joseph

12:1-3 – key passage in Genesis because God calls out Abram to begin a whole new race of people through whom the Messiah will come to save His people.

Other Key verses – 1:1 and 3:15

Since Joseph dies at the end of the book of Genesis, if I wanted to find information about any of the patriarch's or stories that have to do with any of the patriarch's (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph) where would I look?

Exodus – Book of Deliverance

God raises up Moses to deliver Israel from Egypt.

The first half (18 chapters) deal with getting out of Egypt (Deliverance from Egypt)

- Israel in Bondage (1)
- Israel Delivered (2-12)
- Israel journeys to Mt. Sinai (13-18)

The second half (22 chapters) deal with God giving Israel the Law and instructions for worship (Revelation from God).

- Israel given the Law (19-24)
- Israel given instructions for worship (25-40)

Key Verses – 3:7-8 (**Read**)

Leviticus – A Holy People Worshipping a Holy God

The entire book covers only 1 month.

The first 10 chapters – The proper way to **approach** a holy God

The rest of the book – The proper way to **live for** a holy God

You would look in Leviticus for sacrifices, feasts and regulations concerning purity.
